Rationale

As well as quality PE provision enhanced by Continuing Professional Development (CPD) for key staff, we aim to use the funding to give pupils a wider experience of sports/physical activities in the local area, including on the Class 1 residential.

We provide a range of fitness and competitive sport related clubs for all pupils, free of charge, at least one per week for younger pupils and more for KS2. We are considering the whole child and different interests by making gardening part of this, as well as Outdoor Learning in curriculum time.

A healthy amount of competition is encouraged but our main focus is on encouraging everyone to "have a go" and enjoy being active and developing skills and confidence.
