


Parent/Carer Survey Feedback St. Mark's C of E Academy Autumn 2023



My child is happy at a Trust school



"My child loves St. Mark's. They are always keen to attend. They have a good group of friends and enjoy all aspects of school life."


The school's ethos and culture have a positive effect on my child



"I feel St. Mark's teaches children values and how to be a good person which is the most important thing."




My child feels safe at school

The school encourages its children to be respectful and caring






"The children are well behaved and look after each other "

## The school ensures its children are well behaved




The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year



"The newsletter and posts on Dojo show what the children have been learning, as well as offering sessions where the parents can go into school to see what the children have been up to."




When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with in line with our complaints policy



On the rare occasion that a parent concern cannot been resolved informally, the Complaints Policy would and has been followed.




How strongly do you agree with this statement? "My child has SEND and the school gives them the support they need to succeed."


#### The school has high expectations for my child






"The school does their best to ensure their pupils reach their maximum potential through a variety of different applications and learning experiences

## The school lets me know how my child is doing





The school supports my child to take part in a wide range of activities and experiences across and beyond the curriculum




"The children have great enrichment activities offered to them with visitors to the school, after school clubs and trips further away.




We continually review our curriculum offer and after school clubs to provide a variety of experiences for our pupils.
