The children will learn how to listen carefully and why it's important. They will practice this by listening to stories, nursery rhymes, and talking during story




# **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**

Continuous provision gives children a chance to practise what they've learned in lessons. They will use this knowledge during busy learning times, with different activities each week to create many learning opportunities.


### **Maths**

All children are expected to complete the following each week:


- Reading Children are expected to read 5 x per week with an adult. Parents and carers are required to evidence 5 reads in Reading Record.
- 3. **Numbers** When possible, parents are advised to seek learning opportunities in everyday life that involves numbers up to 10. Ask the children if they know what number is being presented when you see it outside of school.
