Personal, Social and Emotional

We will be thinking about the importance of exercise and how we need to be resilient when things get tough. We will continue to build our confidence as we undertake new experiences and learn how to understand the feelings of others.





Physical Development

In our physical development we will continue to learn to move safely in a space negotiating obstacles. We will practice our races in preparation for Sports Day and develop our ball skills, focussing on throwing and catching. We will also develop our handwriting through fine motor skills activities and use scissors safely and correctly.

Communication and Language

We will be learning to ask questions to find out more and to check we understand what has been said. We will use new vocabulary that relates to our theme. We will be able to recall and describe events in lots of detail using wellformed sentences. We will use past, present and future tenses correctly when we talk.



RE

We will be looking at the questions 'Which places are special and why?' and 'Which stories are special and why?' Children will learn that some religious people have places which have special meaning for them. We will talk about the things that are special and valued in a place of worship.

Expressive Art and Design

As artists, designers and musicians we will listen attentively, move to and talk about music, expressing our feelings and responses. We will explore and engage in music making and dance, performing solo or in groups. We will draw and show different emotions through drawings; we will create sculptures of animals from around the



Literacy

As writers and readers, we will: continue to form our letters correctly. In our Read Write Inc sessions we will learn new sounds and use these sounds to read and write sentences. We will share stories about people who help us and animals around the World.

Mathematics

As mathematicians we will: be building numbers beyond 10 using a range of resources, doubling numbers and practising sharing and grouping. Understanding the World

As geographers, historians and scientists we will: recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries.

Children will be encouraged to understand the past through talking about members of their immediate family and community.

All children are expected to complete the following each week:

- 1. **Reading** Children are expected to read 5 x per week with an adult. Parents and carers are required to evidence 5 reads in Reading Record.
- 3. Numbers Children should start to be getting a strong understanding of the numbers 1 to 10. Please seek challenges for the children to test their knowledge out of school. This could include such activities like addition and subtraction.

Homework projects: Activities and projects will be set termly. Homework projects consolidate learning taking place in school. Studies have shown that home learning can be extremely important in a child's cognitive development. It has been proven that your Project 3 – A sound map engagement at home with your child's home learning accelerates their progress.
